Beep Beep Zoom Zoom Drives Home in Inaugural Cam Casby Stakes

Beep Beep Zoom Zoom broke her maiden and won her first career race on Saturday night in the inaugural running of the \$20,000 Cam Casby Futurity. The 300-yard race is restricted to Minnesota-bred 2-year-olds with preference to horses that are also nominated to the Minnesota Futurity held over Labor Day weekend.

The Cam Casby Futurity kicked off Made in Minnesota Day, a card of state-bred restricted races and stakes for both breeds. The race was named after Canterbury Park Hall of Fame member and longtime breeder and owner Camelia Casby, who passed away in 2014.

Beep Beep Zoom Zoom (\$8.00) was ridden by Cristian Esqueda for leading trainer Jason Olmstead. She is owned by Summer Run, Inc. and was bred by Bob Moore Farms, LLC, by Hes Relentless and out of Ette Betta Zoom, by Shazoom. The winning pair finished in 15.729 and earned a speed index of 92.

Beep Beep Zoom Zoom qualified to the \$36,100 MQHRA Stallion Auction Futurity and finished fifth in the final last month.

Runner up Capos Hero and jockey Julian Serrano finished a half-length behind the winner and a head in front of third-place finisher Jess a Lil Cash.

Capos Hero is owned by Corey Wilmes and was bred by Amanda Rae McCabe. The 2-year-old daughter of Capo de Capi is out of Shake Rattlenroll, by Valiant Hero.

Jess a Lil Cash completed the trifecta with jockey Stormy Smith for trainer Bob Johnson. She was bred by Jesse Geditz, by Ja Jess Perfect and out of the First Down Dash mare Dimples Dash O Denim.

Completing the field were Iza Bela B, Wicked 6, Dirt Road King, Vo Fantastic Aria, Chicklet, Give Me Mucho Dinero and Custom Painted Wagon. Myownersbroke, also-eligible, was scratched.

PYC Jess Bite Mydust Get Revenge in Cash Caravan Stakes

It took five races, but Pyc Jess Bite Mydust finally turned the tables on full brother Dickey Bob, defeating him by a nose in the \$35,000 Cash Caravan Stakes at Canterbury Park.

Julian Serrano rode the 5-year-old gelding to victory in 19.704 in the 400-yard race over a muddy track for a 98 speed index.

The two Apollitical Jess geldings had met up in four previous stakes, including last year's Cash Caravan, but Dickey Bob held the advantage over his slow-breaking older brother in their previous meetings. Today, Pyc Jess Bite Mydust broke a step slow and used his late-closing speed to get the best of his brother. Cristian Esqueda lost the irons on Dickey Bob during the race.

Pyc Jess Bite Mydust (\$5.00) holds the all-time earnings record for a Minnesota-bred Quarter Horse and was the recent winner of the Bank of America Canterbury Park Championship Challenge against open company. He has seven wins, \$247,531 in earnings, and has never finished out of the money in 14 starts at his home track at Canterbury.

Pyc Jess Bite Mydust and Dickey Bob are both out of the Pyc Paint Your Wagon mare Paint or More; Paint or More was also a stakes winner at Canterbury. Both are owned and bred by Bruce and Judy Lunderborg. In 2020, another full brother and a half-sister from the Paint Or More family will join the barn as 2-year-olds at Canterbury Park.

Trainer Jason Olmstead swept the early double as the winning trainer of both Quarter Horse stakes on the Made in Minnesota day card.

Holy Storm finished in third place under jockey Nik Goodwin for trainer Pat Swan. Holy Storm was bred by Dan Kjorsvik, by Red Storm Cat and out of the Thoroughbred mare Holy White Socks, by Polished Brass.

The 3-year-old competed in two stakes last year; the Cash Caravan was his first stakes appearance of 2019 and his best stakes placing to date.

Completing the field were Streak N Sparks and Haute Wagon. Jess Doin Time and Polar Xpress scratched.

California Blossom Breaks Track Record in Skip Zimmerman Win

Defeating an evenly matched field of talented open 3-year-olds and up, California Blossom was a clear winner of the \$25,000 Skip Zimmerman Stakes on Sunday at Canterbury Park.

California Blossom (\$14.00) broke the track record for 350 yards in the process, setting the new bar at 17.360. She earned a 109 speed index.

Following a win in the 1889 Futurity immediately before the Skip Zimmerman, trainer Bob Johnson and jockey Stormy Smith swept the early double on the card.

California Blossom is a 4-year-old daughter of Desirio, out of Quiero Dinero, by A Classic Dash. She was bred in California by the Parsons Family Limited Partnership and is owned by George Seward.

The accomplished mare won the \$80,000 Iowa Double Gold Derby last fall at Prairie Meadows; she had also qualified for the Canterbury Park Derby and competed in stakes at Los Alamitos before shipping out to the Midwest.

Three fillies filled out the trifecta in the open Skip Zimmerman, including post-time favorite Fosse in second and graded stakes placed First of 15 in third.

Fosse, ridden by Nik Goodwin for trainer Allen Hybsha, just defeated California Blossom in their most recent race, in which she ran second to Ferrari James. Fosse was bred in California by Paul Jones, by Foose and out of multiple graded stakes winner Check N Fetch. She is owned by Mitch Milliron.

In four starts at Canterbury, she has vet to finish worse than second.

In third place were First of 15 and jockey Cristian Esqueda. One of three entries from the Jason Olmstead barn, First of 15 was a close second in the recent Dash in a Flash Stakes. The Apollitical Jess filly has earnings of over \$165,000 after multiple stakes appearances, including a win in the Gopher State Derby at Canterbury and a second-place finish in the Decketta (G3) at Remington this spring.

First of 15 is owned by Richard Tobin and was bred in Oklahoma by James and Marilyn Helzer, by Apollitical Jess and out of Tinys Corona Queen, by Corona Cartel.

Completing the field were Eagle Deluxe, Quick Dashin Perry, Yes No Yes, Ima Dashin Follie and Painted Dynasty.

Fastest Qualifier Royal Cash Flash Returns to Win \$72,300Gopher State Futurity

Royal Cash Flash, fastest qualifier to the \$72,300 Gopher State Futurity, cleared the field by a half-length was the winner of the final on Sunday afternoon at Canterbury Park.

Royal Cash Flash (\$7.00) was the post-time favorite after posting the fastest qualifying time from four trials on July 28. Jorge Torres was aboard for trainer Clinton Crawford, who swept the trifecta in the Gopher State. It was the first running of the \$72,300 Gopher State Futurity as an open race; the race was previously held as the NCQHRA Futurity with restrictions based on ownership state residency.

Owner and breeder Brenda Reiswig bred the filly in Oklahoma out of Seis the Royal Cash, by Tres Seis. Seis the Royal Cash won the same race in 2013, and remarkably, both fillies did so out of the same post on the inside.

Royal Cash Flash was the second stakes winner of the day at Canterbury sired by First Moonflash. She was one of four horses in the field that also qualified to the \$156,000 Mystic Lake Northlands Futurity and was sixth in final. Second place finisher Left Town was also the second fastest qualifier to the race. He was the second fastest qualifier to the Northlands and was third in the final.

Left Town was ridden by Josh Romero in the trial and final. He was bred in California by Ed Allred, by Kiddy Up and out of Kingman Sis, by Pritzi Dash, and is owned by Renee Wilson.

R elentless Candy and Ry Eikleberry completed the trifecta. Owned and bred in Oklahoma by Pv Quarter Horse Farms LLC, the Hes Relentless filly is out of Roll On Candy Wagon, by Pyc Paint Your Wagon.

Relentless Candy did not qualify for the Northlands but ran third in the consolation, the \$20,000 Mystic Lake Northlands Juvenile.

The ten qualifiers to the first edition of the open Gopher State Futurity included four qualifiers to the \$156,000 Mystic Lake Northlands Futurity, the top two finishers from the \$36,100 MQHRA Stallion Auction Futurity, the first and third horses from the \$20,000 Mystic Lake Northlands Juvenile, and a qualifier to the \$895,200 Remington Park Oklahoma Bred Futurity.

Completing the field were Tipsy Girl B, A Valiant Diamond, Sizzling Fajita, Hr Storm On In, Nanyehi, Special Candy Kisses and A Tres of Sign.

Beep Beep Zoom Zoom Drives Clear in \$63,100 Minnesota Quarter Horse Futurity

Beep Beep Zoom Zoom took an early lead and never looked back as the winner of the first race of the Canterbury Park Festival of Champions Day, the \$63,100 Minnesota Quarter Horse Futurity.

The 2-year-old Minnesota-bred filly stopped the clock in 18.189 in the 350-yard race and earned an 84 speed index. Trainer Jason Olmstead and jockey Berkley Packer swept the Quarter Horse stakes with two winning fillies on Minnesota Festival of Champions Day. Both Quarter Horse stakes races featured record purses.

Beep Beep Zoom Zoom (\$4.80) is owned by Paul and Maren Luedemann of Summer Run Inc and was bred in Minnesota by Bob Moore Farms. The Luedemanns raised the filly from the moment she was foaled, leading to an emotional win for the connections.

The filly is by Hes Relentless, a popular sire among Minnesota Quarter Horse owners and breeders, and is out of Etta Betta Zoom, by Shazoom. Capping a year of several Minnesota-bred Quarter Horses winning and qualifying stakes, Maren Luedemann observed that "Minnesota Quarter Horses are something to reckon with" as the connections watched the crowds fill the apron for the Quarter Horse stakes.

Paul Luedemann accepted the trophy with Maren. "First, I want to thank God, we're thankful to have a horse that can compete in this field. I also want to thank the Sampson Family for giving us this place to race".

The race was the third stakes start for Beep Beep Zoom Zoom and it is her second stakes win. She won the \$20,000 Cam Casby Stakes in her most recent start. The Cam Casby is also restricted to Minnesota-bred 2-year-olds, with preference to horses that were nominated to the Minnesota Futurity. Prior to that, she qualified for the \$36,100 MQHRA Stallion Auction Futurity in July.

Two price horses filled in the trifecta, including Wicked 6 in second place. Wicked 6 was ridden by one of the all-time leading Canterbury Quarter Horse jockeys, Ry Eikleberry, and is trained by Canterbury Hall of Fame trainer Ed Ross Hardy.

Wicked 6 is owned by Clarinda Rohweder and was bred by Steve Pri/byl, by Ocean Runaway and out of the Tres Seis mare Six It Up. Six It Up was a multiple stakes winner, including the Minnesota Derby in 2010.

In third place were Vo Fantastic Aria and jockey Quincy Hamilton. Vo Fantastic Aria is also trained by Ed Hardy is owned and bred by fellow Hall of Fame member Rodney Von Ohlen.

Vo Fantastic Aria is by Fantastic Corona, Jr and is out of Fly Eyeann, by Fly Jess Fly; she is a full sister to the winner of the 2018 Minnesota Futurity, Fantastic Feelyn.

Completing the field were Johnee B, Dirt Road King, Capos Hero, Jess a Lil Cash, Kool Attempt and Iza Bela B. Reigning Berries was scratched following an incident in the starting gate.

Jess Doin Time Dominates in \$59,000 Minnesota Quarter Horse Derby

With a dominating effort in her final Canterbury start of the meet, Jess Doin Time left no questions unanswered as she cruised home in the \$59,900 Minnesota Quarter Horse Derby.

Final time for the 400-yard stake was 20.208, Jess Doin Time earned a speed index of 86.

Plagued by gate issues in several of her most recent starts, Jess Doin Time dodged traffic at the gate and shot clear to win by daylight and pay the people as the post-time favorite.

The 3-year-old filly was ridden by Berkley Packer and is trained by Jason Olmstead; the jockey/trainer combination swept the early double of stakes on Canterbury's annual state-bred stakes day.

Jess Doin Time won the open \$146,400 Mystic Lake Northlands Futurity and the \$45,000 NCQHRA Futurity at Canterbury in 2018. This spring, she qualified for the \$367,800 Heritage Place Derby (G2) at Remington Park.

As a 3-year-old at Canterbury this summer, she qualified for the \$78,050 Canterbury Derby, won an optional claiming event, and then finished second in the \$35,000 Bob Morehouse Stakes behind multiple stakes winner Dickey Bob and a length ahead of all-time leading Minnesota-bred money earner Pyc Jess Bite Mydust.

Tom and Jan Pouliot own and bred the filly, by Apollitical Jess and out of Lenas Rare Lady, by Rare Form. "It's a great feeling to win," said Tom Pouliot. "But when you're the heavy favorite, it's more nervewracking". Jess Doin Time was an upset winner of last year's Northlands Futurity at odds of over 18-1.

With six wins in 13 starts, Jess Doin Time now has earnings of \$161,460.

Holy Storm and Nik Goodwin took the second-place honors for trainer Pat Swan. Dan Kjorsvik owns and bred the Red Storm Cat gelding, out of the Thoroughbred mare Holy White Socks, by Polished Brass.

Holy Storm recently defeated much of this field in an allowance race and followed that win with a third-place finished behind two of the toughest older horses in training at Canterbury, Dickey Bob and Pyc Jess Bite Mydust.

Apolls Reign and Julian Serrano completed the trifecta. Mark Wilson trains, owns and bred the Bp Phoenix Reign filly out of Blazin Apollo One, by Apollo.

Completing the field were Fire N Guns, Haute Wagon, Fly With a Buzz, Fantastic Feelyn, Db Quick Sam, Eos Minnie Pearl and Runnoft.

Berries was scratched following an incident in the starting gate.

Divas First Moon Dominates 1889 Futurity

In the first running of the \$15,000 1889 Futurity, Divas First Moon put on a show for the fans as the 4-length winner of the 350-yard event, the first race on the card and the first of three stakes on Sunday at Canterbury Park.

The final time was 17.789 on a sealed main track; the winner earned a 96 speed index.

Divas First Moon (\$2.20) was a heavy favorite after her recent second place finish in the \$16,600 NDQHRA Futurity behind Sweet Wild Time; Sweet Wild Time qualified for the \$156,000 Mystic Lake Northlands Futurity in July at Canterbury.

Bob Johnson trained the winner as well as the top four finishers in the race, each representing different owners. Stormy Smith had the call on Sunday.

Divas First Moon is a 2-year-old daughter of First Moonflash, out of the Royal Shake Em mare Shake Em Diva. She was bred in North Dakota by her owner, David Wisdom.

Hasta B an Effort was placed second via disqualification with Jorge Torres aboard. Hasta B an Effort is owned by Skip Kahle and was bred in South Dakota by Tyrell Moody, by Hasta Be Fast and out of the Special Effort mare Oh So Effort.

Bhr Jessies Girl and Doug Frink were third for owner and breeder Broken Heart Ranch. Bhr Jessies Girl is a South Dakotabred daughter of First Down Mr Jess, out of Bhr Lookin For Winz, by Looking For Chicks.

Quarter horses bred in South Dakota or North Dakota were eligible to compete in the 1889 Futurity. Canterbury Park and the MQHRA collaborated to offer a special 2-year-old stake restricted to these states as a gesture following the announcement this spring that there would be no live racing in South Dakota in 2019.

Completing the field were Jessabluemoonlady and Outtasightouttamind. Jessabluemoonlady originally finished second but was disqualified for interference and placed fourth. Harleys Wild Fire was scratched.





